



### Student Clinic Scenario Cards

Chapter: *The Student Clinic in Practice* - Print and cut. One card per group. Decide how you, the educator, respond.

<p><b>CARD 1</b></p> <p>A student is halfway through a color and realizes they mixed the wrong developer.</p>	<p><b>CARD 2</b></p> <p>A walk-in client is unhappy that a student is slow.</p>
<p><b>CARD 3</b></p> <p>A student wants to attempt a service beyond their current skill on a real client.</p>	<p><b>CARD 4</b></p> <p>Two clients are waiting and one student is far behind.</p>
<p><b>CARD 5</b></p> <p>A student forgets to drape a client before a chemical service.</p>	<p><b>CARD 6</b></p> <p>A nervous student freezes mid-haircut with the client waiting.</p>



## **Student Clinic Scenario Cards - Instructor Guidance**

*Keep this page; do not hand out with the cards.*

**Card 1 approach:** Step in for safety, correct the mix, and turn it into a teaching moment.

**Card 2 approach:** Reassure the client, support the student's pace, and manage the flow.

**Card 3 approach:** Hold the standard - guide them to an appropriate service or assist closely.

**Card 4 approach:** Reprioritize, support the behind student, and keep clients comfortable.

**Card 5 approach:** Stop and have them drape immediately - client protection first.

**Card 6 approach:** Calmly coach them through the next step and restore their confidence.
